

When did Pixar release Coco?

Coco was confirmed to be released on November 22, 2017. Pixar's very first movie, Toy Story, was released in 1995 that same day. The movie aired first in Mexico on October 27, 2017 at the Morelia International Film Festival, before being aired in theaters in North America.

Miguel's cherished great-grandmother Mamá Coco is very old and fragile, but that doesn't stop Miguel from sharing his daily adventures with her. According to Director Lee Unkrich, filmmakers were touched by so many of the Mexican homes they visited in which multiple generations lived under the same roof.

What happens at the end of Coco?

At the end of the closing credits, there is an ofrenda to the deceased people who inspired the filmmakers of Coco, in the form of a mosaic made from photographs. Coco tells the story of young boy named Miguel living in Mexico (Coco is his great grandmother).

Is 'Coco' a good movie?

What's freshest, though, is the tone and outlook of the film. “Coco” opened in Mexico a month before it opened in the USA and is already the highest grossing film of all time there.

Who composed the score for Coco?

Composer Michael Giacchino, who had worked on prior Pixar animated features, composed the score. Coco is the first film with a nine-figure budget to feature an all-Latino principal cast, with a cost of \$175 million. Coco premiered on October 20, 2017, during the Morelia International Film Festival in Morelia, Mexico.
